

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ABOUT

CLUBSCORE

CLUBSCORE is a queer collective - a small group of people who make art together. Our work is about the experience of transgender and gender diverse people in sport and games. At the moment, the main artists working in CLUBSCORE are Zev and Ketura - two non-binary artists and sports fans.

We collaborate with other artists and community members from time to time.

CLUBSCORE was formed in 2019, and we have been working together ever since. This is the first time we have made art for a public audience.





Gallery, Kambri Cultural Centre 154 University Ave, Acton ACT

Kambri is located in the Australian National University.

Inside the Kambri Cultural Centre, there are multiple venues. The Gallery, where the CLUBSCORE Fantasy Museum will be, is on the second floor, above the bookstore, Harry Hartog. It used to be called "aMBUSH gallery" and some signage still refers to it this way, like the map above.

ACCESSIBILITY

The closest parking is the Kambri underground car park. Entry to the carpark is via Kingsley Street, located in the ANU campus. This is paid parking. There are 6 accessible parking spaces.

The lift from the underground Kambri car park, or the ground floor, will take you directly to the gallery. The lift will only be operational to the Gallery floor during the Museum opening hours.

There is no access to the Gallery via the stairs.

The floor is a fairly even, polished concrete surface.

The closest accessible toilet is approximately 32 meters from the gallery, on the same floor as the installation. Because the door to those toilets will be locked, please see the Visitors Concierge Desk if you need to use it.

Additionally, there are accessible toilets and gender neutral toilets downstairs, on the ground level, accessible by the lift.

We aim to meet your access requirements when you visit. If you have questions or need anything, please visit the Visitor's Concierge Desk in the Gallery at any time, or get in touch via email before you visit.

You do not need to register or buy tickets to visit.

The artists will be at the Museum most of the time it is open, except Tuesday 11th and Wednesday 12th July. You are welcome to interact with the artists, but you don't have to.



DROP IN SESSION: MAKING HISTORY

DATE: Sunday 9th July, 2023

TIME: 3pm-5pm

You can drop in anytime during this session to share ideas and thoughts with the artists. You can tell us what you would like to see in the Museum and we might be able to make it happen over the upcoming week! The vibe will be casual and chatty.

You do not need to register or buy tickets, you can just show up.

WHAT TO EXPECT

This art installation will look a bit like a museum, but it will have artistic elements that make it seem strange.

There will be large scale pictures of people who never really existed - the "history" in this "museum" is not real. There will be descriptions of these made-up people, and pretend artefacts from their life.

A lot of the topics we are highlighting can be challenging, especially for transgender and gender diverse people. We aim to do this in a way that also makes it fun and joyful.

There will be lots of sports references. The main colours used in the exhibitons are black, white, yellow, orange, green and pink.

There will be invitations to participate in lots of ways, but you will never be asked to do anything you don't want to - you are welcome to exist in the space in whatever way you feel comfortable.





SENSORY **EXPERIENCE**



- The Museum and all the associated events take place indoors, but there is a balcony you can step out onto for some fresh air.
- We will discourage guests from wearing perfume or scented products, but we will not enforce it, so you may experience some strong scents. You may also be able to smell a slight chemical smell from some of the art materials we use.
- During the day, there will be a mix of artificial and natural light, as there is a big, uncovered window.
- There will be pops of very bright colours integrated into the visual elements of the artworks. There are no moving or digital elements.
- During the regular Museum Opening Hours, we will play music and there will be the occasional sound of people speaking, the air con, and maybe the sounds of art being made.

We will have some stim toys available at the Visitor's Concierge Desk. You can take one (and keep it!) or bring your own.

You are welcome to stim in the Museum while you are visiting, and during any of the events.

While we don't have a low-sensory space, you can step outside onto the balcony, or through the back doors to the landing where the bathrooms are if you need a break from the main gallery space. See the Concierge for help with the doors.

WORKSHOPS

TOUCHING / NO TOUCHING

DATE: Saturday 15 July, 2023

TIME: 1:00pm-2:30pm

What Is It?

This is a participatory event where you get to come and play a test version of a new sport, and help to improve it.

This workshop will be run by Nick (any/all pronouns) Charlotte (she/her), Miriam (they/them) and TJ (they/them). They are a group of queer artist types, half of whom are also sports coaches, who across their lives have had a mixed experience of being included and NOT included in sports.

What To Expect

We'll spend a good while explaining the sport that we've invented, then guide you through playing it a couple of times, then we'll have a chat about how we can adjust it, then we'll play it another couple of times.

The sport is made up of a few different physical, moving-around games, of the following types:

- -Picking things up and moving them
- -Throwing objects at other objects
- -Balancing on a wobbly surface (assisted if you need)
- -Tagging someone else's body with your hand.
- -Smooshing your body against someone else's

You only have to do the games that you want to do. You can just watch and not participate if you prefer, and if so you can change your mind and join in at any time. You can opt in or out of it at any time. It's up to you exactly what you do and don't do, and how much.

We ask that you come along and participate in the spirit of generosity, silliness, care toward others and trying new things.

EVENT

OPENING CEREMONY (FOR QUEER FUTURES)

DATE: Sunday 16 July, 2023

TIME: 6:00pm - 8:00pm

This event will be Auslan interpreted.

The "Opening Ceremony" is held on the last night of the Museum being open, which is partly us having a joke, and partly our way of saying that this is just the beginning of a future in which trans people are celebrated in sport. It will have elements that are similar to other Opening Ceremonies (for the Olympics etc), but it will have a queer, fun, irreverent vibe.

The flavour and vibe of the night will be ritualistic, ceremonial and silly. You will be asked to enter and move about the space in ceremonial and professional ways, in the spirit of taking it seriously to make it more fun.

There will be performances from four queer drag/performance artists, MC'd by CLUBSCORE artist Zev who will be playing a character called "The Host" who will be quite dramatic. Think football commentator mixed with stadium show MC.

There will be four separate drag acts, with some talking by the host in between the acts.

The acts are:

- Mister Butch Venividivici- singing and drag performance, presenting a CLUBSCORE Anthem, which has will be composed especially for this event.
- Radha: a live cooking show drag performance, which will provide the audience with a spicy warm beverage to drink.
- Kaotic Desirez- Horrorcore drag performance, which will involve the audience arraying themselves around the outside walls to leave maximum space for the performer to dance in.
- Val Volkov- Dance Performance, also taking up the central space.


Attendees will watch the performances, which will be amplified through a PA. You will be able to stand, sit in a chair or sit on the floor. Performances will be happening in different parts of the space across the night, so you may have to occasionally change your position. Plenty of time will be allowed for that.

After the four performances the Opening Ceremony Playlist will be played. From then the space will be much freer and less ceremonial, you can just hang out and dance and chat until we close the space. The playlist will be put together by visitors to the Fantasy Museum throughout the week prior.

This event is likely to be loud at times, and there will be stage lighting which might be brightly coloured.

There will be pre-recorded music and live singing.
